Research Associate of Cal Poly Humboldt, Dr. Peloso has spent decades documenting and protecting these species, combining science, art, and storytelling to raise awareness and inspire action. This talk will guide us through a journey of over 20 years documenting biodiversity leading to his most recent accomplishment: EXTINTOS, an international exhibition featuring Dr. Peloso's photography and illustrations by young artists, highlighting species that may soon be lost forever.
